

PAID WORK EXPERIENCE

- (WEX)Paid temporary work experience in a field or industry of interest
- A great opportunity for job seekers with little or no experience
- Similar to internship opportunity
 - 160 hours at 23.75/hr (subject to available funding)





PAID EDUCATIONAL TRAINING (ETPL)

- Paid training scholarship in a field or industry of interest
- A great opportunity to study or train for free
- Similar to an apprenticeship with certification at the end
 - length depends on course/program




HOW TO ENROLL IN YOUTHWORKS



ELIGIBILITY

- Attending school (as defined by State law); including secondary and post- secondary school;
- Ages 16-21
- Live in the San Jose, Morgan Hill, Gilroy or San Martin area
- Low-income or living in a low resource area and or receiving any sort of public assistance (Medi-cal, SNAP, TANF, RCA...)





Youth will need have an additional barrier that affects your ability to complete your career or educational goals such as...

- An English language learner (someone who has been placed in ELD classes, English is not your first language, or primarily speaks a language other than English at home/with family)
- School dropout or someone who has missed a quarter
- Basic Skills Deficient
- Been in Juvenile or adult justice system
- Within 2 years of exhausting TANF
- Identify as LBTQIA+
- A homeless individual, a runaway, in foster care or has aged out of the foster care system, a child eligible for assistance of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. 677), or in an out-of-home placement
- An individual who is pregnant or parenting
- An individual with a disability


