





Occupational Therapy

The Master of Science in Occupational Therapy program is designed for students who have earned a baccalaureate degree in a discipline other than occupational therapy. It enables the student to obtain the education and degrees necessary to be eligible to practice as an occupational therapy is completed including successful completion of the required 6 months of fieldwork, the student is eligible to sit for the national certification examination. Successful completion of the examination qualifies the candidate to apply for national certification and state licensure. The Occupational Therapy Department will welcome the first cohort of students for the Occupational Therapy Doctorate (OTD) degree in Spring of 2023.

Our program is a 4-year course of study that includes academic courses, clinical rotations, and a doctoral research project (110 units total). The faculty is committed to student success.
