Sacramento Violence Intervention Program



Connecting youth to life-saving resources.

A partnership between Kaiser Permanente South Sacramento's Trauma Services and WellSpace Health, the Sacramento Violence Intervention Program (SVIP) addresses youth violence in the Sacramento area. The voluntary program is offered free to victims of violence who are treated at Kaiser Permanente South Sacramento Medical Center and other area hospitals. Program intervention specialists work with youth and young adults, ages 15 to 26, after violent injuries to prevent retaliation and re-injury by setting short and long-term goals.

Goals may include:

- Attain a high school diploma, GED, vocational training or preparation for college.
- Achieve employment by linking clients to job training, job readiness and/or job placement programs.
- Improve health status by linking clients and families with mental health support and providing long-term mentoring to sustain progress after graduation from SVIP.
