The Gathering Inn Mental Health Clinician

Since 2016, Kaiser Permanente's support for The Gathering Inn's (TGI) Mental Health Clinician Program has allowed over 450 homeless individuals in Placer County to receive individual and group counseling sessions.

Through this program, depression and anxiety scores among participants dropped significantly, allowing them to better attend to their long-term needs like permanent housing and employment.

St. Vincent de Paul Free Clinics



Kaiser Permanente is helping to fund two urgent care community clinics run by the St. Vincent de Paul Society of Roseville.

These clinics provide free access to medical evaluation and prescription medications for urgent medical problems for uninsured and low-income Roseville-area people, including the homeless and undocumented immigrants.
